


DAY 7 - VOLUNTEERING WITH RED CROSS IN GHANA -

To avoid traffic jams in Accra, Aaron - Nestlé Ghana Corporate Communication Manager - picked me up this morning at the hotel at 6h15 for my first visit to Nestlé Ghana head office.

- Introduced to other early morning colleagues.
- Visited the office and took pictures of very nice paintings depicting everyday consumers with their everyday Nestlé products – See below a composition of the best off.



- Met Freda Duplan, Nestlé Ghana Managing Director.
- Discussed with Aaron: we foresee to introduce key Nestlé stakeholders (Ministries, Civil Society, Private sector, Academia, etc.) to Red Cross in view of **scaling up and amplifying the impact of the Nestlé / Red Cross partnership**.
- Walked to Red Cross office (10 minutes away from Nestlé Ghana office).
- Continued organizing the field visits with the Red Cross team.

Below further insight about my mission in Ghana with Red Cross

Ghana Red Cross Society is to start its first Global **Water and Sanitation** Initiative (WATSAN also called WASH) project, with plans to scale-up into “flagship” concept, integrating **Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR)**, **Nutrition**, and **Reproductive Maternal New-born and Child Health (RMNCH)** components, while the **Rapid Mobile Phone-based system (RAMP)** will be used to collect and analyze data, and measure progress and impact. An initial site evaluation and identification was conducted mid2015, including mapping and screening of over 340 communities in Ashanti and Eastern regions of Ghana based on predefined criteria.

A baseline survey for WASH, DRR, and nutrition components will be conducted in all selected sites in mid-November ← This will be the main objective of our field visits!

NB: these selected sites corresponds to our Nestlé cocoa farmer's districts.
